

# Winter

## Power words (key vocabulary)

<b>Winter</b>	Winter is the coldest season.
<b>Weather</b>	Weather is the daily state of air, in any given place.
<b>Freezing</b>	A change by cooling.
<b>Temperature</b>	A measure of the warmth or coldness of an object or material.
<b>Thaw</b>	A change by warming from solid to a liquid.
<b>Hibernate</b>	When an animal slows its heart rate to save energy and survive the winter without eating much.

## Winter Facts

Winter comes after Autumn and before Spring.

In Winter in the UK there are less daylight hours than in Summer.

Winter happens at different times of year in other countries.

Some animals change their coat colour in Winter.

Some animals hibernate in winter.
