## Art (Class 3, Terms 5 and 6, Cycle B) – Weaving

**Summary:** This term we are exploring weaving. Weaving is an ancient art/craft where two threads are interlinked to form a fabric or textile, often resulting in a pattern. One set of threads are held tight on a frame vertically; these are called the warp. The weft runs across the warp threads moving over and under the weft


